Syllabus for Sculpture

This course is designed to develop proficiency both Clay Pottery and Sculpture skill. Student will explore pinch pot, slab, coil, carving, modelling and wheel throwing techniques to create abstract, realistic, non-objective and symbolic work in clay. Example of work are vessel, Figurines mask and portrait busts.

Students will create both utilitarian and expressive work. Student will also work with a wide variety of sculptural forms. Media used to create artwork include but are not limited to: wire, plaster, wood, clay mould making techniques, modelling clay and found objects.
